FOR BARBER ESTABLISHMENT OWNERS, SUPERVISING BARBERS, AND TEMPORARY LICENSEES

The following section must be signed by the barbering establishment owner and overseeing barber, or the temporary license will not be issued.

The barbering establishment must receive the temporary license prior to that individual working inside the barbering establishment.

A temporary license is valid only for the individual named on the license.

A temporary license is valid only for the specified barbering establishment and location.

An individual must be at some stage of the testing process and have submitted an examination application and prescribed fee to the Board office along with a signed temporary license application before a temporary license may be issued to the individual.

The establishment listed on the temporary application must be a currently valid licensed barbering establishment and the supervising barber must be currently licensed.

Every temporary license application must be signed by the supervising licensed barber of that licensed barber establishment.

A temporary license is only valid for a 90-day period. Once it has expired the individual is no longer able to work inside the barbering establishment without first obtaining a new temporary license.

Each individual is only authorized three temporary licenses.

The barbering establishment owner is accountable for ensuring that all individuals working inside the barber shop have the proper licenses posted at their workstations.

If an individual fails the practical (hands-on) portion of the Barber Board examinations, the temporary license becomes void, and the individual will no longer be authorized to work inside a barbering establishment.

By signing the temporary license, the barbering establishment owner, supervising barber, and temporary licensee risk fines and/or disciplinary action if the conditions of the temporary license are found to be violated.
